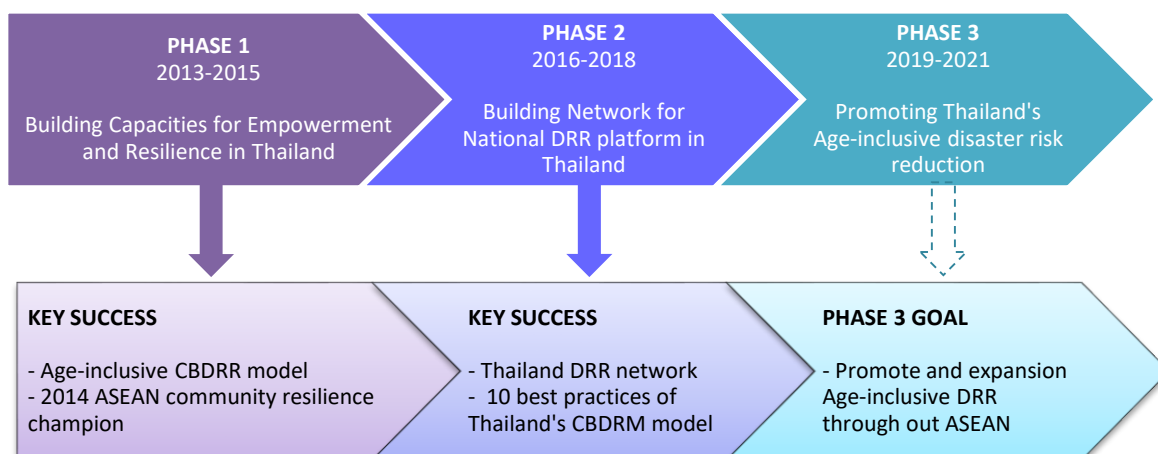

Background and Situation assessment	<p>In the last few decades, Thailand has faced a number of major natural disasters, including the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, the 2011 Thailand floods, the 2014 Mae Lao earthquake, the 2015-16 Thailand's droughts crisis, irregular rainfall, decreased agricultural and fishery yields and rising sea-levels. The impact of disaster variability and extreme natural hazards results in not only loss of human lives, but also damage to infrastructure, along with disruption of livelihoods and economic activity.</p> <p>The combination of more extreme climate and disaster events coupled with the failure to adapt DRR responses to the ageing demographic trend has the potential to increase older people's vulnerability to risks and disasters. Yet, the specific requirements and strengths of older people are often not given appropriate consideration in DRR.</p>						

	<p>The background of this proposal is the Thailand programme of FOPDEV in partnership with others.</p> <p>Since 2013, FOPDEV, supported by Prudence Foundation, has expanded its work related to age-inclusive in DRR at community, the national policy and ASEAN levels. At the ASEAN level, FOPDEV's role as focalpoint of ADDMER work program (AWP) in Thailand and bring the evidence-based of community resilience champion to others. At the national policy level, FOPDEV's efforts have focused particularly on older people as a resources in DRR. At the community level, work is often based on village Older People's Groups (OPGs) and the newly formed Community-based Disaster Risk Reduction team (CBDRR) that help monitor the needs of older people in disasters and help older people improve their roles to participating in disaster planning and response.</p> <p>FOPDEV's past work has identified directions for the future, including: linking the CBDRR team more directly with OPGs, using media to disseminate information, and linking community work more closely to local authorities (LAs), government and Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM). At the national level, recent building DRR network in Thailand successes have mobilised coalitions and identified gaps in the CSOs capacity and resources, which will be addressed in this action.</p>
<p>Intended Results</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sustainability, replication and scaling impacts of Age-inclusive DRR (Age-inclusive DRR sub-grants) As a pre-condition for project approval, FOPDEV will require that potential partners explicitly address age inclusiveness, sustainability, replicability and scaling impacts of DRR actions within a reasonable timeline. This will involve a clearly defined approach to phase-out or handover either to the target group, the appropriate authorities, or to an appropriate longer-term funding instrument. FOPDEV will also require that partners have strong and demonstrated capacities in community-based approaches, in advocacy with relevant institutions and that they plan to integrate the proposed action into longer-term DRR programme. Ad-Hoc funding may be provided to specific actions as part of an emergency response. Shared responsibility, Complementarity, Coordination and Partnerships (Networking and Regional Volunteers) DRR requires and fosters coordination at various levels. The existing DRR network will get more bonding, expanding and sharing experiences among the network in Thailand and ASEAN country. The foundation for 'Safe Steps' and 'Build Now' promoting DRR contributes to build a culture of safety and resilience at all levels. 3. Integrated and Targeted Age-inclusive DRR (Awareness raising and Policy Advocacy) Advocacy is particularly important in promoting the adoption of DRR by partners, local and national institutions and other stakeholders. Overview



The CSO community across the region is diverse in their types, mandates, sizes and capacity. Overall, sustaining operations of a CSO consultative body at national and ASEAN regional level is a constant challenge. While this may be difficult to achieve even in the long-term, it remains a challenge to mobilise CSOs with legitimate representation acceptable to governments and CSOs themselves. There are a number of ASEAN Member States (AMS) that have institutionlised local CSO representation (such as Indonesia, Philippines, and Thailand) but maintaining these mechanisms is both a challenge for the CSOs themselves and the government.

In Thailand, FOPDEV with supported by Prudence Foundation since 2013 have a great opportunity to implemented the program phase 1, '*Building Capacities for Empowerment and Resilience in Thailand (2013-2015)*' and phase 2, '*Building Network for National DRR platform in Thailand (2016-2018)*'. These enhanced the role of older people in community-based disaster risk reduction (CBDRR) and represent as success model in ASEAN level.

Strengthening current national CSOs to effectively work with their governments at national and local levels has been proven as one of the successful and sustainable approaches to achieve disaster and climate-resilience.

The project in phase 3, '*Promoting Thailand's Age-inclusive disaster risk reduction (2019-2021)*', aim to strengthen the OPGs and CSOs capacity to promote consolidation and expansion of age-inclusive DRR in Thailand and ASEAN.

Implementation plan

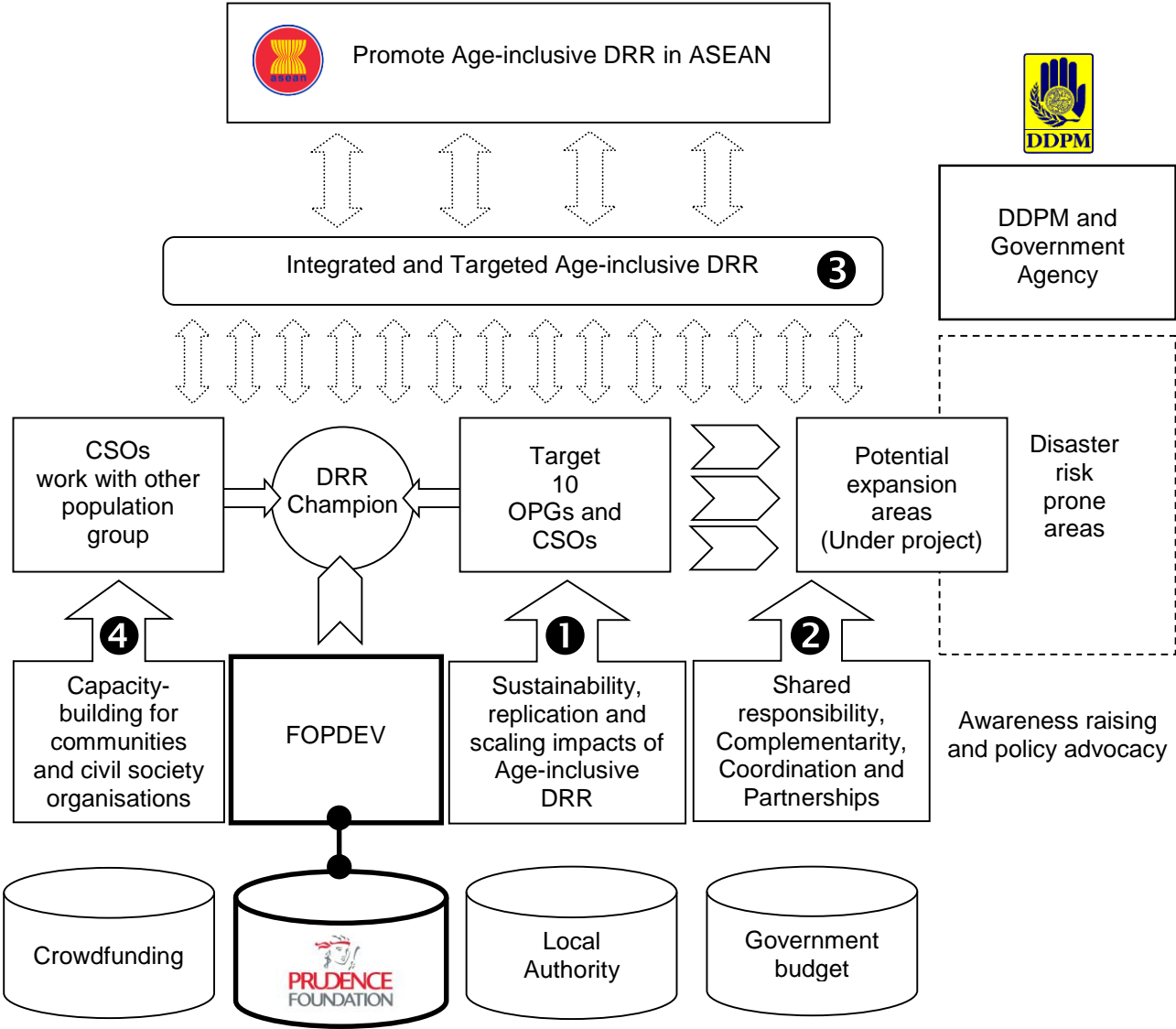


Diagram show project implementation plan and activities.

N.B.: Cash Flow Requirement for Year 1:

The proposed three years project period is July 2019 to June 2021 and cash flow requirement for Year 1 as follow.

- **First installment payment:** Q3 of 2019 for GBP 42,000 (60%)
- **Second Installment payment:** Q2 of 2020 for GBP 28,000 (40%)

Results and Activities:

1. Sustainability, replication and scaling impacts of Age-inclusive DRR will achieve through strengthening the collaboration and capacity of existing CBOs & CSO network on DRR and partners on fund raising and Age-inclusive DRR sub-grants management for their implementation and expanding on Age inclusive on DRR and community resilience:

The project - Age inclusive on DRR sub-grant is initial seed fund that aim to use for strengthening on fund raising and the sub-grant management capacities of existing CBOs & CSO network on DRR and their partners to effectively implement their DRR plans and incorporate Age inclusive on DRR as the best practices and community models. These CBOs & CSOs networks and partners will be supported the capacity building , technical supports and learning networks that have increased their capacities to access funds and resources from available government funds, private sectors and public funding agencies including international donors. These strengthened networks and partners on DRR can be able to continue their implement and expand on Age inclusive on DRR and community resilience during and beyond the project period. The project will coordinate to set up the working group for managing and processing this sub-grant and provide technical supports and coaching for effectively implement and reporting a granted sub-grants of targeted OPGs & CBDRRs and the networks on DRR. The working group will consist of representative from FOPDEV, CSO Partners, Local Authorities, relevant funding organisations from government, private sector and public fund raising agencies. The project will provide technical supports and coaching for the network on DRR on fund raising for their DRR plans during and beyond the project period. The project sub-grants will start to provide to existing the network on DRR and Partners collaborated with FOPDEV . The sub-grant size is set maximum amount of 2,650 GBP with in twelve months period. This sub-grant will be managed and allocated budget by contracting between FOPDEV's and grantees based on their approved activity proposals.

In addition, the project initial Ad-hoc fund for emergency response is designed to work with the actively network on DRR to be able to contribute the emergency reponse especially affected older people and other vulnerable groups in increasingly natural disasters and public hazards in Thailand. This model of Ad-hoc fund for emergency response will be used to mobilise the resources and funds from the network on DRR, private sectors and public funding in the future.

1.1 Set up and strengthen the project working group capacities on technical, operational and management on DRR sub-grants and raising for processing the Age inclusive on DRR sub-grants, emergency fund and fund raising from multi-donors.

1.2 Strengthen the collaboration and capacity of existing CBOs & CSO network on DRR and partners on Age-inclusive DRR sub-grants management and fund raising from multi-donors

1.3 Technical support and coaching to existing CBOs & CSO network on DRR and partners to access funds and resources from relevant government, specific funding agencies, CSR and Public funding agencies for implementing their DRR activities and age-inclusive on DRR

1.4 Effectively manage and support the Ad-hoc fund by collaborated CBOs & CSOs network on DRR to contribute an emergency response to affected natural disasters with actively CBOs & CSO network working areas.

1.5 Collect and document the model on effectively sub-grant management and fund raising for implementation and expanding on DRR and community resilience

1.6 Monitoring, Reporting and Evaluation (MR&E) – the project will introduce an online and social media communication support the project monitoring and reporting. Social Impact Assessment (SIA) also will apply to the monitoring and evaluation of this project in collaboration with Sal Forest Co., Ltd (<http://www.salforest.com/>). This MR&E system will work with the project working group, focal points of involved CBOs&CSOs network on DRR including relevant partners.

2. Shared responsibility, Complementarity, Coordination and Partnerships will achieve through coordination and facilitating an experiential learning among CSOs network on DRR and volunteers on Age inclusive on DRR at local, national and ASEAN levels:

The project aims to expand the cross learning and advocate on Age-inclusive on DRR at ASEAN level in close collaboration with HelpAge International and its affiliation and CSOs network on age-inclusive on DRR. Two targeted ASEAN's CSOs are identified and selected to involve in networking activities. They are 1) YAKKUM Emergency Unit (YEU) in Central Sulawesi, Indonesia and Coalition of Services of the Elderly, Inc. (COSE) in Bulacan, Central Luzon, Phillipines. YEU has long experiences on emergency responses and

rehabilitation to recently affected people include older persons on earthquake and Tsunami in Central Sulawesi in late 2018 and many other volcano eruptions. COSE has long experiences on implementation and policy advocacy on older people's rights and their contribution to older persons' development including emergency responses to many severely Typhoons all over the country. They have been collaborated with HelpAge International to implement the Age inclusive on disasters programme and involve in ADDMER Partnership Group (APG) as CSO contribution to ASEAN Disaster Management policy and programing. Thus these two ASEAN's CSOs have enrich valuable experiences on DRR to learn and share including advocate related DRR policy both national and ASEAN levels.

2.1 Network collaboration meetings at sub-national levels in Northern, North Eastern, Central, Southern region – CSOs networks and relevant partners collectively organize meetings to learn, share and collaborate their work experiences on DRR and Age inclusive on DRR including emergency responses.

2.2 Network collaboration meetings at national levels - CSOs networks and relevant partners collectively organize meetings to learn, share and collaborate their work experiences on DRR and Age inclusive on DRR including emergency responses.

2.3 Network exchange visit at national level – The project will support and facilitate a field exchange visit among CSO networks on DRR and community resilience in different context, disasters and public hazards. This include issues on age-inclusive on DRR and public hazards.

2.4 Network seminar at national level –The project will support and facilitate the network to attend and contribute in the national seminar on DRR and public hazards.

2.5 Document the network best practices and dissemination – The project will support the network to collect best practices and vulnerable groups including age-inclusive on DRR, will produce and share among the CSO networks including relevant policy makers and general public.

2.6 Network exchange visit at ASEAN Level – The project will collaborate with CSOs work on age-inclusive on DRR with HelpAge International, these CSOs are YEU in Central Sulawesi, Indonesia and COSE in Bulacan, Central Luzon, Philippines to rotate organize exchange visit in Thailand for the first exchange visit activities.

2.7 Network seminar at ASEAN level – The project will support the representative of the networks involved in the project attend and contribute in the seminar at ASEAN level.

2.8 Monitoring, Reporting and Evaluation (MR&E) – The project will study and report on CSO networks on DRR for their learning and best practices, collaboration, contribution and partnership during the project period.

3. Integrated and Targeted Age-inclusive DRR will achieve through organizing an awareness raising and Policy Advocacy activities for promoting the adoption of DRR among relevant partners and stakeholders at local and national levels:

3.1 Public awareness raising; The project will produce media products and collaborate with mass media and community media for support dissemination and public awareness raising activities. The project will coordinate and produce the essential media products and get from relevant partners for dissemination to the project targeted communities, OPGs, CBOs and CSOs network on DRR and relevant partners from government agencies and private sectors. The involved network will introduce to use smartphone to document and tell their success stories including advocate relevant policy in form of social media. The project will also work with mass and community media to produce the project success stories for broadcasting to reach policy makers and general public.

3.2 Policy engagement with government – The project will support OPGs/CBDRRs/CSOs and partners on DRR to involve and contribute to relevant local and national debate on DRR and public hazards.

3.3 Attending the DRR courses, policy maker meetings and events at national level – The project will support OPGs/CBDRRs/CSOs and partners on DRR attend and contribute to the DRR courses, policy maker meetings and events organize by government agencies in collaboration with CSOs network and relevant UN agencies.

3.4 Attending the DRR courses, policy maker meetings and events at ASEAN level for example ASEAN Disaster Management Day (ADM) (13 October every year) and International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction (IDRR) etc.

4. Capacity-building for communities and civil society organisations works on DRR will achieve through age friendly trainings and supports to develop the model on age inclusive on CBDRR and community resilience which contribute to generate a culture of safety and resilience at all levels:

The potential 10 targeted communities in 5 provinces cover Northern, North-Eastern, Central, Southern regions of the country are selected base on their involvement in project activities both phase I and phase II including interest in age inclusive on DRR and life safety from public hazards. These 10 targeted communities are include 3 communities in Chiang Mai at Pong Nam Ron and Mon Pin Sub-districts; 2 communities in Chiang Rai, Mae Sruay Sub-district; 1 community in Mae Hong Son at MocChumpae sub-district, 1 community in Khon Kaen at Khok Soong Sub-district; 1 community in Ayudhdhaya and Nong Po Sub-district; and 2 communities in Krabi at Koh Klang Sub-district. The OPGs/CBDRRs in these communities are eligible to get the project age-inclusive sub-grants and emergency fund as complementary fund and resources for their implementation on CBDRR and community resilience supported from local authorities and other relevant government and CSR private sectors.

4.1 Train Age-friendly resource persons from the targeted communities of the project areas in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Khon Kaen, Ayudhdhaya and Krabi provinces.

The project will train at least 30 communities and older person leaders in targeted communities. They will voluntary act as age-friendly resource persons in management and resource mobilisation including implementation and support sub-granted activities on age inclusive on DRR of CBDRR committees and communities

4.2 Technical supports for field training to existing OPGs and CBDRRs and their partners in targeted communities of the project areas in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Khon Kaen, Ayudhdhaya and Krabi provinces

The project will provide technical supports and coaching to OPGs and CBDRRs and their partners in targeted communities to effectively conduct needs and capacities assessments with communities and use this information to develop, access funds and implement on suitable sub-grant activities on age inclusive on DRR from multi-donors. This assessment information and the outputs will also use to advocate for older people in discussion with LAs at local and provincial levels.

4.3 Provide approval sub-grants and technical supports to the OPGs/CBDRRs and their partners for better managing the sub-grants for their implementation and developing a model on age inclusive on CBDRR and community resilience.

The project will provide technical support and coaching for OPGs/CBDRRs in targeted communities granted an approval the project sub-grants. These OPGs /CBDRRs and the age-friendly resource persons will implement and generated a model on age inclusive on CBDRR and community resilience. The successful models will be used for experiential learning and advocating among CBOs & CSOs network on DRR and DRR policy at local and national levels.

4.4 Technical and coordination supports to policy and plan coordination including monitoring the project activities and accessing funds and resources for implementation of OPGs/CBDRR action plans with Local Authorities and relevant donors and funds.

The project will coordinate to initiate working group on DRR policy and plan coordination at sub-district level among the OPGs/CBOs and LAs including existing local partners. The project will collaborate to have quarterly meetings for the coordination and monitoring including generating a model on age inclusive on DRR for facilitate learning among CBOs and CSO networks on DRR including incorporated in DRR policy at local and national levels

4.5 The monitoring, reporting and evaluation (MR&E)– Project will design and carry out the ME&R for the OPGs, CBOs and local partners on their capacities on trainings and working on age friendly trainings and supports to develop the model on age inclusive on CBDRR and community resilience and culture of safety.

Regarding to Leveraging ‘SAFE STEPS’: - The programme and issues of SAFE STEPS will incorporate in project plans and implementation in all four results and activities mentioned above initially start at community based implementation (Results and activities 4 and 1) and share in networking activities (Results and activities 2) including awareness raising and policy advocacy activities (Result 3).

In addition: Opportunities for Volunteer work in Thailand in the targeted communities and implementing areas of the participating CBOs & CSOs networks especially in 5 provinces in North, North Eastern, Central and Southern Region. The following are some of opportunities for Prudential employees to get involved in the project:

1. Participate in facilitating and lead training on DRR (Disaster Risk Reduction) with older people and community;
2. Participate in the repair and improve of older people’s homes follow the universal design and age friendly environment and
3. Exchange skills and knowledge by working together with villagers.
