2. Executive summary

This project is on “Promoting Thailand's Age-inclusive disaster risk reduction” for three years period during July 2019 to June 2022. This project aims to strengthen the OPGs and CSOs capacity to promote consolidation and expansion of age-inclusive DRR in Thailand and ASEAN. This project has planned to implement with three main target groups including Older People Groups (OPGs) and their members including older people with disability; relevant local, national and international CSOs and Mass media; including Local Authorities (LAs) and government agencies etc. This has expected to reach the final beneficiaries a total of 16,000 persons during three years of the project period as detail above mentioned and in Annex A. The four project purposes are to be achieved within the project period include 1) Sustainability, replication and scaling up impacts of Age inclusive DRR by implementing the Sub-grant and Ad-hoc Emergency Fund including technical supports; 2) Shared responsibility, complimentary, coordination and partnership by co-organising activities among collaborated multi-organisations and networks on DRR; 3) Integrated and targeted Age inclusive DRR by implementing the awareness raising and policy engagement on DRR ; including 4) capacity building for community and CSOs work on DRR. The summary of situations, progressed activities, achievements, challenges and next activities included as follow.

In this report start briefly the achievements of the project implemented on the project activities of PhaseII during January to June 2019. The air pollution PM.2.5 has been severely problems and impacts to everyday living of the people in the Bangkok and major cities in the country especially in Chiang Mai. In Chiang Mai and Northern Provinces had double impacts from haze from fires on wastes, farming residues and forest fire during January to April 2019. The government has announced the air pollution PM.2.5 is national agenda. The project has also worked with CSO network in Chiang Mai to participate and contribute to solve the problems and reducing risk including safety life for vulnerable groups include older people. The highlight achievements in this report period included **1) the action plan** to develop community learning center on DRR and FOPDEV’s Age inclusive DRR model at Pong Nam Ron, Chiang Mai for support expanding the model to other disaster prone areas; **2) the collaborated with two CSOs network at national and international levels** to jointly develop, collect and shared the best practices and successful model including existing the project lesson learned on DRR (DRR book) of CBOs and CSOs including partners. These CSOs included Chiang Mai Breath Council consist of CSOs work on environment especially air pollution PM.2.5, environment and forest fire in Chiang Mai, Power of Older People Network (POP network) with 15 member organisations; Thai NGO Coordinating Committee (NGO Coord.) with 40 member organisations; Thai Society of Gerontology and Geriatric Medicine at the Annual Assembly 2019 and Co-Risk-Lab, an internal national organisation on DRR. These CSO networks will collaborate and work on DRR with FOPDEV in longer term; and 3) Project staffs and involved CBOs, CSOs and partners on DRR participated and contributed **to two the policy meetings**. These policy meetings consulted the policies related to DRR included 1) **the using open big-data for management forest fire** including forest fire mobile application by community volunteer, this policy is under GISTDA in Ministry of Science and Technology and 2) the **National Disaster Management Plan** organised by DDPM in collaboration with UNISDR.

The project had recruit one **new staff on Assistant to Project Manager** to replace two turn over staffs of Project Staffs and Project Assistant including purchased one notebook for supporting the project implementation. While the project team consulted and prepared the project proposal PhaseIII 2019-2022.

In this reporting period of July to December 2019, there were severely two natural disasters happen in Thailand and neighboring counties. First is heavy rain the make **flash flashed and flooded in north-east provinces** including Khon Kaen and Ubon Rachathani during September to October 2019. Which had impacts to many lives and their livelihoods including government and public infrastructures. Second is **Earth Quake in Nan and Lao PDR** that also reached small impact in the project area in Mae Suai, Chiang Rai. FOPDEV and the project have not yet capacities to expand to responses and rehabilitation to these to natural disasters. FOPDEV and project staff have started to improve capacity of the staffs and networking including partnerships for better preparedness plan to response and rehabilitation including strengthening community resilience during the implement the project PhaseIII 2019-2020 in close collaboration with HelpAge International.

In this reporting period most of 14 out of 16 the planned activities under 4 expected results were implemented according to the action plan 2019. The implemented activities could be able to work with 191 older persons and CBDRR team, 50% are women and 31% of total participants which are from 8 OPGs in 3 targeted provinces in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai and Krabi. Total of 14 older persons and youth with disability, 69% are women were visited and supported OPGs in the areas to continuously carry out home care together with Village Health Volunteers in 7 communities in Chiang Mai municipality and Koh Klang Sub-district in Krabi. The project targeted groups of multi-partners collaborated and involved in implementing the project activities, total of 621 persons, 54% is women. These involved participants included 69% of total participants are CBOs-CSOs; local authority and government officials including others partners and mass media. The impact was on 1,350 persons of beneficiaries of involved OPGs' members and project targeted groups in this reporting period. There are 36 representatives from 8 Local Administration Organisations (LAOs) and government agencies and 25 representatives from 10 CSOs and mass media agencies participated and contributed to the project implemented activities in this report period.

The main achievements based on the results assessment in this reporting period were as follow.

- 1) The Result 1 achievement included on two CSOs collaborated and contributed to work on CBDRR in highland communities in Mae Ai District, Chiang Mai and the community services on safety and age friendly living environment for disadvantage older persons in Municipality of Chiang Mai.

One CSO is **Ethnic People Development Foundation (EPDF)**, registered as NGO. The project provided piloting **the Sub-grants, 40,000 THB** (approx. GBP 1,081) and technical supports to implement the project on assessment situation and capacity of communities to develop proposal for strengthening CBDRR in the period three months, started from October 2019. Three highland communities, Lahu ethnic group in Mae Ai Sub-district, Mae Ai District Chiang Mai are in this project. These targeted communities has total population is 1,848 persons, 48% are women live in 344

households. There also has a total older person population is 120 persons, has the Thai citizenship, only 6.5 % of the total population.

Second CSO is **the Institution of Technical Education (ITE) –College West from Singapore**. FOPDEV staffs and ITE’s team of teachers and students including members of OPGs and community 60 persons organised 5 days event to do **community services on safety and age friendly living environment for disadvantage older persons** in Municipality of Chiang Mai during September 2019. A total of seven disadvantage older persons and their houses and surround living environment were taken home visit and repairing age-friendly for their houses including home and living areas environment in the areas.

2) The Result 2 achievement included three indicators as follow.

First, an increased understanding of older people’s participation to age-inclusive on DRR by collaborating and share responsibility work with three CSOs and their DRR network in Chiang Mai, Krabi provinces.

One CSO is the **“Chiang Mai Breath Council” in English translation or “Sa Pa Lom Hai Jai Chiang Mai” in Thai words** consist of 38 interested member CSO organisations has aimed to mobilise communities and society to involve in sustainable solving problems on air pollution PM2.5 and environment in Chiang Mai. FOPDEV with OPG network and CBO network on DRR involved and collaborated to implement on **awareness raising on PM2.5 in municipality of Chiang Mai and the project areas in Chiang Mai and Chiang Rai; support the piloting the project sub-grant to the council on participatory risk communication on the air pollution including involved in the steering committee member** as representative of FOPDEV & OPG network in Chiang Mai. Forty persons of FOPDEV staffs and OPG’s leaders trained on communication and social media skills for volunteer communicators that have to produce and disseminate on air pollution PM2.5 risk and mitigation among OPG network and public in collaboration with facebook page **“WeVo Sue Soo Foon”** <https://www.facebook.com/wevogroup/> and ThaiPBS –C-site report <https://www.csitereport.com/#!/pm25noclus>.

More one is CSO network on DRR in Krabi province, Southern Thailand. This network namely **“Community Disaster Management Network - Krabi Provincial Administration Organisation” (DMN KPAO** and have the network members from CBCDRM network in 7 Districts of Krabi. FOPDEV and Raks Thai Foundation in collaboration with Ban Tha Klong Community Working Group and the network on coastal resources management & CBDRR of Koh Klang Sub-district, Koh Lanta District in Krabi; Provincial Community Network on Disasters Prevention and Mitigation in Krabi; Koh Lanta Tambon Administration Organisation (TAO) and Provincial Administration Organisation (PAO) in Krabi **co-organised the public awareness campaigning** on two days event in memorable of 15 years Tsunami at Ban Tha Klong during 24-25 December 2019. The event was produced and disseminated at TV Choomchon Andaman Mankong - <https://www.facebook.com/watch/securedandamancommunitytv/> for example the video live of the event at <https://tinyurl.com/y9psu7qx>

And More CSO is **CO Risk Labs as International working group on DRR**. FOPDEV co-organised two main activities include a **week-long workshop focusing on community mapping on flood vulnerability and Older People Talk - experiencing on community – based disaster risk management, and in the end jointly presented the activity results highlighting age-inclusive DRR others at the exhibition titled**

“Living with Water”: UR Lab Art & Science Fair, at Weave Artisan Society, Chiang Mai province. These activities integrated and shared with Co-Risks Labs organised a month-long art and science non-conference called “Understanding Risk Field Lab: Chiang Mai Urban Flooding 2019” during June 2019.

Second, an increased ASEAN regional CSOs and CSR volunteers cross learning and contributing to promote age-inclusive on DRR in collaboration with HelpAge International's affiliation and network. **Two FOPDEV staffs attended to workshop on Building the Emergency Preparedness capacity of Network Members and Working Partners of HelpAge International in Asia region** which organized by APRO HelpAge International in Chiang Mai during 2-6 December 2019. The FOPDEV staffs have planned to introduce and build up the emergency response management team and action plan in relation to the existing FOPDEV DRR programme and project with Prudence 2019-2022

Third, an increased community resilient with age inclusive on DRR among CBOs and CSOs network models and learning sites on DRR. **The project collaborated and supported the Community and Local Authorities and relevant partners to participatory collect an information, resources persons and best practices including model on Age inclusive on flash flooding disasters management at the village of Ban Pieng Kok, Moo 6, Pong Nam Ron Sub-district, Fang District, Chiang Mai** in close collaboration with Pong Nam Ron TAO, OPGs, Community leaders, CBDRR committee members, Women and Youth groups including relevant government agencies in the areas. The collecting information, resources and action plans from consultation meetings has planned to use for establishment the community learning center on Age inclusive DRR.

- 3) The Result 3 achievement included on awareness raising&policy engagement as follow. First, project **produced and disseminated the Asia-Pacific Regional Strategy for Age-inclusive Disaster Risk Management 2019-2030 of HelpAge International both Thai and English languages** to the existing national CSO network and multi-partners on DRR & CCA in the relevant meetings, seminars including shared electronic files through direct emailing, social media through group line application and facebook page on DRR and CCA example page-DRR and CCA network – Thailand. Second, CSO representatives involved and delivered policy advocacy on the policy on strengthening older people groups/organization to participate in preparedness and solving the older persons problems and have healthy and wealthy live and the policy on CSO participation on National and ASEAN Disaster Management Plans and implementation. The project staff and CSOs network on **DRR participated and contributed to social policy recommendation especially policy on strengthening older people groups/organization to participate in preparedness and solving the older persons problems and have healthy and wealthy live**. The event is to the policy forum of National Health General Assembly for preparedness of ageing Society. The forum organized by the National Health Committee, Ministry of Health and relevant government agencies, CSOs and private sector on 4-6 July 2019. Project staff and CSOs network on DRR **participated and contributed to the preparation meeting and organized the event on ADDM/IDRR2019 at Department on Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) Office in Bangkok** during 11 July and 10 October 2019 respectively. This year event has campaigned theme on safety school and safety hospital and organized at DDPM office on 10 October 2019.

- 4) The Result 4 achievement included three CBOs and OPGs on increased capacities of OPGs & CBOs on effectively community assessment, proposal formulation, assessing funds & resources and implement on suitable sub-grant activities on Age inclusive on CBDRR from multi-donors as follow:

First, **The OPG in Nong Hoi and and Neighboring communities** organized consultation meeting for reviewing their progress activities, experiences and information on CBDRR for hazards on flooded and air pollution PM.2.5 including forest fire and waste management and the training plans on Age inclusive DRR..

Second, **the community and OPG leaders including representatives from Mae Suai District Hospital** organise consultation meeting for their training plans on Age inclusive CBDRR and their community development plans on registration of OPG to be officially certified CBO from Provincial Social Development and Human Security Office, in Chiang Rai and registration on community managed herbal forest in close collaboration with Mae Suai District Hospital and related government agencies.

Third, **Village committee, the community and group including OPG leaders in Ban Pieng Kok**, Moo 6, Pong Nam Ron Sub-district, and Fang District Chiang Mai organised consultation meeting for their their Age inclusive DRR plan and related community development plans in collaboration with local authorities and the FOPDEV including relevant government agencies

The overall project management has managed in line with the project plan and allocated resources in six months period July to December 2019. Deputy Executive Director and four staffs were allocated to manage and implement in this project. The project staff were rotated to work in other FOPDEV's project since January 2019. **The newly staff on Assistant to Project Manager recruited from April to December 2019. One computer notebook purchased for Project Manager because of his old Notebook Computer did not work properly. Total of 58.32 % (GBP 11,198.29= THB 483,125.19) of overall the project expenditures** exclude funds on the Sub-grants and Ad-hoc Emergency were used for the project management and implementing activities in this report period as detail in enclosed the 1st Interim Financial Report 2019. There was expenditures only 5% of total the sub-grant funds and not yet has expenditures for the Ad-hoc funds. **There are two CSO's partners have sharing the resources and co-funding to implement the project activities include Co-Risks Labs as International network organization on DRR and Raks Thai Foundation, Krabi Office.** The rest of the project budget 42% and the remained funds of the Sub-grant and Ad-hoc Emergency will support to the project implementation during January to June 2019.

3. Assessment of results and activities:

The detail implemented activities and outputs used for assessment the project results are in Annex B.

3.1. Result 1: Sustainability, replication and scaling impacts of Age-inclusive DRR (Age-inclusive DRR sub-grants). This result will achieve through strengthening the collaboration and capacity of existing CBOs & CSO network on DRR and partners on fund raising and Age-inclusive DRR sub-grants management for their implementation and expanding on Age inclusive on DRR and community resilience.

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on increased CBOs and CSOs networks on DRR develop and access to funds and resources from relevant fund, private sectors, and public funding agencies including Social and Volunteer contribution as follow.

1) The project provided **one piloting the Age inclusive DRR sub-grant to Ethnic People Development Foundation (EPDF)**. EPDF is None Government Organisation (NGO). The sub-grant's objective is to promote community learning process and community preparedness for managing risks from natural disasters and public hazards in highland communities. **This sub-granted-project has implemented areas in three highland communities of Mae Ai Sub-district, Mae Ai District Chiang Mai.** These communities are Ban Doi J Na, Ban Doi Laem and Ban Tad Mok, mostly population are Lahu ethnic people. **There has a total population is 1,848 persons, 48% are women live in 344 households. There also has a total older person population is 120 persons, has the Thai citizenship, only 6.5 % of the total population. An amount of 40,000 THB (approx. GBP 1,250) of Sub-grant budget contracted to support for implementing project above mentioned for three months during October 2019 to January 2020.** The project provided on the job training on age friendly community in one consultation meeting to EDPF field staffs and community leaders in the targeted group this has increased EDPF's staffs experiences that could be able to implement in the rest of targeted communities. EDPF has planned to continuously preparing the better project and/ideas based on participatory collected information and staffs' experiences for solving the identified problems in these targeted communities. And EDPF has planned to seek collaboration and funds from local authorities, interested CSOs & private sector including from Age inclusive Sub-grant in longer term.

2. The collaboration with **the Institution of Technical Education (ITE) –College West**, in Singapore. Project contributed FOPDEV and ITE's team of teachers and students to implement the event on community services for older persons in Municipality of Chiang Mai. **A total of 60 participants involved in the event included 15 Older Persons, 67% are older women; 25 are members of CBOs& CSOs and 20 are teachers and students of ITE West College Singapore.** The output of this community services activities included total of **seven disadvantage older persons and their houses and home area environment were taken home visit and repairing age-friendly for their houses including home and living areas environment** throughout 5 days period of the event.

3.2. Result 2: Shared responsibility, Complementarity, Coordination and Partnerships (Networking and Regional Volunteers). This result will achieve through coordination and facilitating an experiential learning among CSOs network on DRR and volunteers on Age inclusive on DRR at local, national and ASEAN levels.

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on increased CBOs and CSOs networks on DRR have greater understanding of older people's participation to age-inclusive on DRR including safe steps and build now as follow.

1) The collaboration with **newly initiated CSO network on DRR** namely **“Chiang Mai Breath Council”** in English translation or **“Sa Pa Lom Hai Jai Chiang Mai”** in Thai words **has office and operation in Chiang Mai, Northern Thailand. The council has started and formed with 38 interested member organisations plus individual members on 9 September 2019.** This council has aimed to mobilise society and individual in Chiang Mai and national levels to sustainable solve the problems and impacts on world ranking no1 on pollution PM.2.5 and environment including community managed forest fire in Chiang Mai. The outputs of this collaboration included 1) FOPDEV and People Movement on Health initiated the collaborated action plans on increasing knowledge on impacts and health prevention for older persons from endanger PM.2.5 pollutions and related environmental pollutions and hazards in Municipality of Chiang Mai and in the project areas; 2) FOPDEV and Sa Pa Lom Hai Jai in area on risk communication and social campaigning on pollutions PM.2.5 has planned to collaborate to carry out on piloting the social communication platform in early 2020 and 3) FOPDEV and older people network invited to be one committee member of the council for contributing the policy and plan on Age inclusive DRR including implementation the action plan in the FOPDEV and project areas in Chiang Mai.

2) The collaboration with **CSO network on DRR in Krabi province, Southern Thailand** organized the two days event related to 15 years after Tsunami disaster. The event aim to raise awareness, collect best lesson learned and strengthen coastal community resilience on community development and problem solving in sustainable coastal resources management and disaster risk reduction. **The event title is “15 years after Tsunami - Andaman coastal communities and new challenges”.** **The event co-organised with Raks Thai Foundation in collaboration with Ban Tha Klong Community Working Group and the network** on coastal resources management & CBDRR of Koh Klang Sub-district, Koh Lanta District in Krabi; Provincial Community Network on Disasters Prevention and Mitigation in Krabi; Koh Lanta Tambon Administration Organisation (TAO) and Provincial Administration Organisation (PAO) in Krabi. The event has five activities included one public awareness raising forum, two workshops, fisheries conservation (fingering crabs) and home visit for frail older people and disability people. **A total participants of 200 persons participated in the event.** These participants have 97 persons (49%) are women and 34 persons (17%) are older persons, 11 persons (33%) are older women. These participants are from 28 organisations of CBOs; CSO network on DRR and Health and Development in Krabi, School network on conservation water work with Raks Thai Foundation; Local and Provincial Government Agencies on local

authorities, coastal resource management, DDPM including representative from political party and local mass media. **This event outputs included** 1) the participants have **increased awareness on the coastal community experiences on building back better from impacts of Tsunami disaster and increasingly climate induced hazards and disasters**. These experiences collectively agreed to integrate in the local curriculum of School in the areas and provincial level; 2) **the older people group in Koh Klang Sub-district have involved and indicated their roles and action plans** on knowledge transferring, actors in CBDRR planning and implementation for Tsunami and future coming natural disasters. They facilitated to take home visiting to six disabled youth and frail older persons; 3) **The provincial network on DRR in Krabi identified and proposed their plans** on coastal resources management for food and livelihood security and better preparedness on community resilience and safety to Tsunami and other climate induced disasters including public hazards; 4) **Raks Thai Foundation** together with Tha Klong Working Group and the community network including Koh Klang TAO **shared and contributed their budget and resources** to successful organise this event.

3) The collaboration with **CO Risk Labs, International working group on DRR:**

FOPDEV took part in a month-long art and science non-conference called “Understanding Risk Field Lab: Chiang Mai Urban Flooding 2019” organized by the Co-Risk Lab. This programme aimed at exploring critical design practices in disaster risk management, cooperative technology production, hacking, and art as well as fostering collaboration across disciplines, practices, and geographies. Following this, **FOPDEV co-organised two main activities include a week-long workshop focusing on community mapping on flood vulnerability and Older People Talk - experiencing on community – based disaster risk management, and in the end jointly presented the activity results highlighting age-inclusive DRR others at the exhibition titled “Living with Water”: UR Lab Art & Science Fair, at Weave Artisan Society, Chiang Mai province.** A total number of participants: 43 persons, 23 (54%) are women; 20(47%) are older persons and 11 (55%) are older women. These participants attended in three activities are 24 community representatives, 19 UR Flooding), 19, 10 community representatives respectively toward activity date. The outputs for the meetings included **1) Flood Vulnerability mapping done by Older People in Nong Hoi community 2) Tentative Community Disaster Management Plan of Flooding 3) Strengthen network on DRR among Older People Association in disaster risk areas in Chiang Mai and Chiang Rai and 4) Presentation at the exhibition and attended the opening**

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on increased ASEAN regional CSOs and CSR volunteers cross learning and contributing to promote age-inclusive on DRR in collaboration with HelpAge International's affiliation and network as follow:

The collaboration and networking with **APRO HelpAge International and the Network Members and Working Partners in ASEAN and Asia region collectively promote Age inclusive DRM in the Region.** Two FOPDEV staffs attended to workshop on Building the Emergency Preparedness capacity of Network Members and Working Partners of HelpAge International in Asia region which organized by APRO HelpAge International in Chiang Mai

during 2-6 December 2019. The purpose is to develop a skilled work team of HelpAge APRO and Network members/ Partner staffs with the knowledge in skills in conducting humanitarian preparedness and response aligned with humanitarian Standards. A total of 20 participants were attended the workshop and they are come from ASEAN and South Asia countries. The outputs of the workshop included 1) the participants are able to explain and demonstrate their organisations' safety, security including humanitarian preparedness and responses programme at country level; 2) strengthen networking and partnership with START network for emergency fund for CSOs; 3) Learn to map institutional humanitarian response capacities on ALERT software and 4) plan to develop and maintain scenario based response plans and minimum preparedness actions. **In addition FOPDEV staffs have planned to introduce and build up the emergency response management team and action plan in relation to the existing FOPDEV DRR programme and project with Prudence 2019-2022.**

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on increased community resilient with age inclusive on DRR among CBOs and CSOs network models and learning sites on DRR as follow:

The project collaborated and supported to participatory **collect an information, resources persons and best practices including model on Age inclusive on flash flooding disasters management at the village of Ban Pieng Kok, Moo 6, Pong Nam Ron Sub-district, Fang District, Chiang Mai** in close collaboration with Pong Nam Ron TAO, OPGs, Community leaders, CBDRR committee members, Women and Youth groups including relevant government agencies in the areas. Two consultation meetings organized at Sub-district and the Village levels for collecting information, resources and **action plans to support for establishment the community learning center on Age inclusive DRR.**

3.3 Result 3: Integrated and Targeted Age-inclusive DRR (Awareness raising and Policy Advocacy). This result will achieve through organizing an awareness raising and Policy Advocacy activities for promoting the adoption of DRR among relevant partners and stakeholders at local and national levels.

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on increased awareness of Age inclusive on DRR amongst CSO networks, relevant government agencies and private sectors as follow:

Project managed and supported to produce and distribute **the Asia-Pacific Regional Strategy for Age-inclusive Disaster Risk Management 2019-2030 of HelpAge International both Thai and English languages.** The document disseminated and shared to the existing national CSO network and multi-partners on DRR & CCA The outputs of the activity included 1) mutual-understood related FOPDEV's staffs and CSO network and multi-partners on DRR; 2) updated FOPDEV's policy and plan including support implementation on existing Prudence Foundation funded project –FOPDEV-PFDRR2019-2022.

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on At least 40 representatives from civil society collaboratively deliver advocacy activities on safety life and social security for vulnerable groups including older persons affected from increasingly natural disasters and public hazards as follow:

1) Project staff attended to **the policy forum of National Health General Assembly for preparedness of ageing Society**. The forum organized by the National Health Committee, Ministry of Health and relevant government agencies, CSOs and private sector on 4-6 July 2019. The project staff participated **and contributed to social policy recommendation especially policy on strengthening older people groups/organization to participate in preparedness and solving the older persons problems and have healthy and wealthy live.**

2) Project staff participated and **contributed to the preparation meeting and organized the event on ADDM/IDRR2019 at Department on Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) Office in Bangkok during 11 July and 10 October 2019 respectively**. This year event has campaigned theme on safety school and safety hospital and organized at DDPM office on 10 October 2019. A total of 150 participants from relevant government agencies, CSOs, private sectors and International Development Organisations participated in the event. The output of this event **included the participation and distribution the project lesson learned in the event on ADDM/IDRR2019.**

3.4. Result 4: Capacity-building for communities and civil society organisations works on DRR (Set up and train the project team). This result will achieve through age friendly trainings and supports to develop the model on age inclusive on CBDRR and community resilience which contribute to generate a culture of safety and resilience at all levels.

The outputs and activities that indicate to achieve indicator of this result on 10 trained OPGs & CBOs effectively conducted needs and capacities assessments with communities and use this information to develop, access funds and implement on suitable sub-grant-activities on age inclusive on DRR from multi-donors as follow:

1) The project supported for following up consultation meeting in **Nong Hoi and Neighboring communities was jointly organized with representatives of OPGs and representatives of Home Care Volunteer Club in Municipality of Chiang Mai including community leaders**. A total 29 participants participated the meeting included 20 older persons and 13 (65%) are older women; 8 are representatives of CBOs and 1 from local authority in the area. The outputs on CBDRR included 1) **progressed activities of community** included 1.1) having the experiences on preparing and using the community risk and vulnerable mapping to flooding hazards, emergency response to flooded hazards in the community. This experiences learned, shared and took from community workshop with international participants involved in Chiang Mai Urban Flooding Lab organized by Co Risk Lab above mentioned in Activity and Result 2; 1.2) having the experiences on intergeneration working on community services for disadvantage older people in Municipality of Chiang Mai. This experiences learned, shared and took from activities on Improving age-friendly house and living area for older people in Municipality of Chiang Mai with Institute of Technical Education (ITE) – West College, Singapore above mentioned in Activity and Result 2; 2) **the training plans on Age inclusive**

CBDRR 2020 including collaboration with CSO network on DRR for example newly CSO network, namely Sa Pa Lom Hat Jai Chiang Mai for involving and contributing to sustainable solve problems on pollution PM.2.5 and forest fire in Chiang Mai.

2) The project supported for following up consultation meeting in Mae Suai, Chiang Rai was **organized with community and OPG leaders including representatives from Mae Suai District Hospital on 24 December 2019**. A total of 24 participants participated in the meeting, 14 (58%) are older persons without older women in this meeting, 8 persons are community and CBDRR committee members and 2 are government official from Mae Suai District Hospital. The outputs of the meeting included **1) the training plans on Age inclusive DRR 2020** for CBDRR committee, OPGs and related CBOs' representative and **2) Other community development plans** included 2.1) registration of OPG to be officially certified CBO from Provincial Social Development and Human Security Office, in Chiang Rai and 2.2) registration on community managed herbal forest in close collaboration with Mae Suai District Hospital and related government agencies.

3) In addition, linked to Activity 2.5 under Result 2, **Project organized the consultation meeting at Ban Pieng Kok, Moo 6, Pong Nam Ron Sub-district**, and Fang District Chiang Mai. A total 45 participants participated the meeting included 14 older persons and 10 (71%) are older women; 29 are representatives of CBOs and 2 from local authority in the area. The meeting outputs included **1) the village and CBDRR committee members have included more members from women group, youth group, community volunteer and committee member of the village's zone**. They will take care and implement their Age inclusive DRR plan and related community development plans in collaboration with local authorities and the FOPDEV including relevant government agencies

4. What next?

The highlights of activities will be implemented in the next six months of January – June 2020 as follow.

1. Strengthen the collaboration and capacity of CBOs & CSOs and their network on DRR and CCA, public hazards including road safety and first aid skill for reducing disaster risks and safety life of people in the project areas through processing and technical supports of the Age inclusive DRR sub-grant and Ad-hoc Emergency funds.
2. Organise the national network on DRR event that integrate activities of meeting cum seminar including strengthening CBOs and CSOs in Chiang Mai. The objectives are to share and learn the experiences on social movement for solving air pollution PM.2.5 and sustainable forest fire management as model in Chiang Mai, updating and knowing among existing CSO network on DRR including collaboration with the project Phase III 2019-2022
3. Organise the public awareness raising activities and events on air pollution PM.2.5 and relevant public hazards especially in Chiang Mai and Northern Thailand
4. Participate in the relevant policy engagement especially on the air pollution PM.2.5 and public hazards has impacts on health and socio-economic of older persons' leaders, volunteers and community.

5. Selectively attend to relevant DRR and public hazards courses, policy meetings and events at both national and ASEAN levels.
6. Organise the capacity building activities for OPGs, CBDRR committee, CBOs and their network including their partner in areas of a) the community resource persons on Age inclusive CBDRR including facilitating, thinking and communication skills, the Sub-grant management and fund raising, Social Impact Assessment including public awareness and policy engagement etc.
7. Facilitate staff capacity building and strengthen the preparedness plan to responses.

These activities will be implemented in close collaboration with existing multi-partners and the CSO network on DRR and CCA including relevant government agencies and private sectors.
